Life Group / Reflection Questions

Read Luke 11: 1-44

- ➤ What is the purpose of the Gospel of John? Read John 20:30-31
- ➤ Who were Mary, Martha, & Lazarus? What is their relationship to Jesus? Do we see them appear elsewhere in scripture?
- Was there any other audience with Jesus? John 11: 7. Who was the audience that saw Lazarus resurrected? John 11:33
- ➤ What was John trying to show us about Jesus from this story?
- ➤ How is this scripture structured? What is the progress of thought? Is there a central theme? Hint: Resurrection! How does the theme of resurrection progress in this passage? Why is this so important at this time in Jesus' ministry?
- ➤ What does Jesus say his purpose is for waiting to raise Lazarus from the dead? John 11:4, 14-15, 25-26, 42 ... Why do you think God's timing is different from ours? What could be so different about our perspective?
- From this scripture what do we learn about Jesus?
- From this scripture what do we learn about ourselves? What's something you're currently waiting for God to do for you? What might He be doing in you while you wait?
- In this scripture where do we see the Gospel? (Jesus is King, He made a way for us to experience his kingdom for those who believe!) How is Jesus leading us into his kingdom life? When was a time God exceeded your expectations? Do you think this might be a glimpse of Jesus' Kingdom on earth?
- ➤ How am I to relate to Jesus in light of this passage?
- ➤ What truths or promises can I claim in light of this passage?
- How am I responding to the Gospel (Trusting in Jesus to lead me into his kingdom life) to live out this passage? What will I do in response to what I have learned from God's word?

TWO THINGS TO REMEMBER WHEN WAITING ON GOD

When Martha heard that Jesus was coming, she went out to meet him, but Mary stayed at home. ²¹ "Lord," Martha said to Jesus, "if you had been here, my brother would not have died. ²² But I know that even now God will give you whatever you ask."

John 11:23-26
